old - making such an emotional connection to the food that we eat was an eye-opener for some and provoked some lively debate, resulting in the conclusion that we all have a choice about what we eat and that we should respect one another's choices.

ATTENDANCE

With the school year now well underway I would like to thank those parents/carers who have ensured that their children have achieved good attendance. At present the attendance figures for each school are as follows: Lynton 97.8%; Parracombe 96.7%; Kentisbury 96.3%. The national target for attendance is 97% with the national average for primary

schools sitting at 96%, so it is good to see that we are close to the target and, at the moment, exceeding the national average. Good attendance is the essential foundation to positive outcomes for our children; missing just a few days of school can have a negative impact upon learning. If your child is genuinely unwell they should not come to school, but all other absences should be kept to an absolute minimum. Requests for exceptional absence will only be authorised in accordance with our Attendance Policy and requests for absence in order to take advantage of cheaper term time holidays, celebrating birthdays, meeting up with relatives, going shopping, etc, will not be authorised. Unauthorised absences will be reported to the Local

Authority and could result in a fine being issued. In this event, each parent is issued a fine of $\pounds 60$, which rises to $\pounds 120$ each if it is not paid within 21 days. If the fine is not paid after 28 days, prosecution may follow. We will be continuing to monitor attendance on a regular basis, including punctuality, and will be arranging to discuss with you your child's attendance should it fall below 96%.
